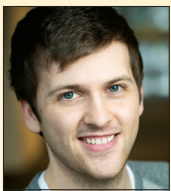

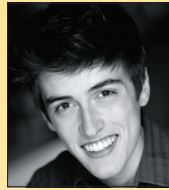
### **AUSTIN STOLE** (Benny Southstreet)

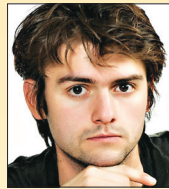
### **KYLE SCHWARTZ** (Harry the Horse)

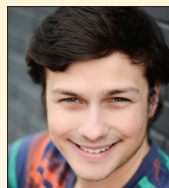
### **NICOLAS SULLIVAN** (The Greek/Chorus/Dancer)

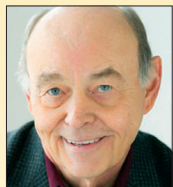

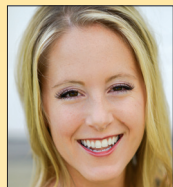

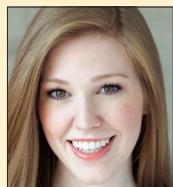
**NIKKI ZWOLSKI (Dance Captain/Chorus/Dancer)** is

**JO SWERLING (Author)** Born in Russia in 1897, Jo Swerling was a playwright, screenwriter and vaudeville sketch writer. Mr. Swerling's long career began as a reporter and feature writer in New York and Chicago.

**ABE BURROWS (Author)** After studying to be a doctor and an accountant, Abe Burrows had a career in sales before becoming a successful radio script writer and writer/performer of musical parody numbers. His first Broadway libretto was *Guys and Dolls*, co-written with Jo Swerling, with a score by Frank Loesser. Among the musicals for which he provided librettos are *Make A Wish*, *Can-Can* and *Silk Stockings* (both with scores by Cole Porter), *Say, Darling*, and *How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying* (which he also directed; score by Frank Loesser). His non-musical plays include *Cactus Flower* (wrote and directed) and *Forty Carats* (directed).



**FRANK LOESSER (Music and Lyrics)** One of America's great composer/lyricists, Frank Loesser began his songwriting career during the Depression as a lyricist, contributing songs to Broadway revues and nightclub acts. His work with composer Irving Actman in the 1936 revue *The Illustrator's Show* led to a songwriting contract in Hollywood, where he spent the next eleven years working with such composers as Burton Lane, Jule Styne, Arthur Schwartz and Hoagy Carmichael. Some of his film songs from that period include "Two Sleepy People," "Jingle Jangle Jingle" and "I Don't Want To Walk Without You." The first song for which Loesser wrote both words and music was "Praise The Lord And Pass The Ammunition," written during his World War II service. His Hollywood work after the war included the hit songs "Spring Will Be A Little Late This Year," "A Slow Boat To China," and the 1949 Oscar-winning song "Baby, It's Cold Outside." In 1948 Loesser was approached by fledgling Broadway producers Cy Feuer and Ernest Martin to write music and lyrics to George Abbott's libretto for an adaptation of the classic Brandon Thomas play *Charley's Aunt*. The new musical, which starred Ray Bolger, was called *Where's Charley?* and was a hit. This led to Loesser's next show, the hugely influential and successful *Guys and Dolls* in 1950, also produced by Feuer and Martin, with a script by Abe Burrows and Jo Swerling. In 1956 Loesser wrote the libretto, music and lyrics for his next show, *The Most Happy Fella*, adapted from Sidney Howard's play, *They Knew What They Wanted*. This impressive score contains over 30 musical numbers and makes extensive use of operatic techniques and forms, including recitative, arias, duets, trios and choral numbers. In 1960 he provided the score and was co-librettist

for *Greenwillow*. In 1961, Loesser wrote the score for the Pulitzer Prize-winning *How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying*. His last show, *Pleasures and Palaces*, closed in 1965 during out-of-town try-outs.

**R. KENT KNUTSON (Artistic Director/Director)** has served as Artistic Director at the Old Log Theatre the past five years. During that time he has directed over 20 shows, musicals including the longest running musical in Old Log's 76-year history: *Million Dollar Quartet*. He has also directed five children productions including his original adaptations of *The Reluctant Dragon*, *Jack and the Beanstalk*, *The Jungle Book* and the current production of *Snow White and the Seven Vikings* for Old Log Theatre. Kent worked 43 years developing and directing theater at Blaine, Anoka and Minnetonka high schools before retiring to work at the Old Log. In all, he has directed over 250 productions, helped in the planning and design of five newly-constructed theaters, started three professional companies, developed nationally-renowned high school theater programs and has lovingly worked with thousands of fantastic high school, elementary and adult performers.

**KYLE PICHA (Musical Director)** Previously at Old Log, Kyle worked as Musical Director for *Ghost*, *Million Dollar Quartet*, *The Wedding Singer*, and *Life Could Be a Dream* (2014). Regional credits: music director for Yellow Tree Theatre and Second Fiddle Productions. He is also music supervisor for Minnetonka Theatre and High School. Kyle works professionally in the Twin Cities as vocal coach and musician for various theaters and churches. He received his training in Musical Theatre Performance from AMDA (NYC). 22. **TALYA DOZOIS (Choreographer)**

Originally from Los Angeles, Talya has been training, performing and setting choreography for over ten years. She has worked in LA, NY and Chicago with some of the top choreographers and dancers in the industry. **DEB KNUTSON (Assistant Director)**
